

opportunities, competence, and commitment. Drucker cautions: "Never subordinate the mission in order to get money. If there are opportunities that threaten the integrity of the organization, you must say no." • Who is our customer? "The primary customer is the person whose life is changed through your work... Primary customers may be infants, or endangered species, or members of a future generation." • Drucker notes that customer needs evolve.
